

Dear colleagues,



- The 4CH KB will be organized according to a standard ontology CRM_{4CH} fully compatible with CIDOC CRM. CRM_{4CH} will incorporate several extensions.
- 3D models based on HBIM avail of IFC (International Foundation Classes): mapped onto the CRM and extensions such as CRM_{BA}
- 3D modelling activity: CRM_{3D}
- Scientific conservation data: combination of CRM_{SCI}, CRM_{PE} and CRM_{DIG}
- Indexing text documents: avail of NLP and NER technologies
- Definition and structuring of controlled vocabularies and thesauri,
 preferably multilingual ones: build on de-facto standards such as Getty AAT
